Welcome Collegiate Members!

The newly adopted International Constitutional amendment states:

Collegiate members shall be undergraduate or graduate students who meet the following criteria:

- a. Undergraduate student collegiate members shall
 - (1) be enrolled in an institution offering an education degree and have the intent to continue academically and professionally in the field of education; an
 - (2) be enrolled within the last two years of their undergraduate education degree.
- b. Graduate student collegiate members shall have graduate standing in an institution offering an education degree and have the intent to continue academically and professionally in the field of education. When a collegiate member starts her career as a paid educator, she will pay active member dues and become an active member. If a collegiate member does not pursue a career as an educator, her membership will expire upon graduation or withdrawal from the education degree program.

<u>Virginia Holt</u> - (April 4, 1905-April 23, 2007) Pi Chapter President 1949-51. Graduated from East Tennessee State University. Taught for AC Schools for 43 years. Began her career at Briceville. Taught 7th grade at Shinliver and retired in 1970. In 1995, some Pi Chapter sisters picked her up at the Winwood Nursing Home and brought her to our chapter meeting to celebrate her 90th birthday. She was 102 at her death in April 2007 and was our last surviving charter member.

Rubye Augusta Wallace (Aug. 23, 1903-April 3, 1963) Served as Pi Chapter's first treasurer form 1943-46 and as chapter President form 1951-53. In 1943 she taught at Blowing Springs Elementary.

2019 Xi State Scholarship Application Now Available

The Xi State Scholarship Committee under the leadership of chair Marsha Rains has updated the 2019 application for members seeking financial assistance with expenses for earning advanced degrees.

- 1. Scholarships available to be awarded:
 - a. The Lois Jones Special (Stipend of \$3000) for pursuing a doctorate (Ph.D., Ed.D., J.D.).
 - **b. Isabel Wheeler** (Stipend of \$3000) for pursuing a doctorate (Ph.D., Ed.D., J.D.).
 - c. Maycie K. Southall (Stipend of \$3000) for study beyond the Master's Degree.
 - d. Mary Hall (Stipend of \$3000) for study beyond the Bachelor's Degree.
 - e. Evangeline Hartsook (Stipend of \$1250) for study beyond the Bachelor's Degree.
 - f. Lottye McCall (Stipend of \$1250) for study beyond the Bachelor's Degree.
 - g. Louise Oakley (Stipend of \$1250) for study beyond the Bachelor's Degree.
 - h. Eleanor Osteen (Stipend of \$1250) for study beyond the Bachelor's Degree.
 - *Not all scholarships will be awarded each year; decisions to award or not will be made based on availability of funding and/or the number of qualified applicants.
- 2. Eligibility:
 - a. Applicants must be members of a Xi State chapter for at least **three** calendar years.
 - b. Service to Delta Kappa Gamma is an important criterion in the selection of a recipient.
 - c. Applications that are electronically submitted on/before the deadline (**February 1**st of the year awarded) and are complete will be scored using the Application Review Form. A minimum score is required to be considered for a scholarship. Please review this rubric carefully.

 Incomplete or late applications will not be eligible for consideration.
 - d. Former recipients of a major scholarship (\$3,000) may not reapply.

Application and rubric are available on the Xi State web site. Please be aware that the new application process requires online submission of information via Google Docs so applicants will need to create a Google email account including a photo. The submission date is February 1, 2019. Link to Xi State Scholarship Application. Please contact Scholarship Chair Marsha Rains at marsharains@yahoo.com if you have questions. Members may also apply for one of the 30 International scholarships granted yearly - \$6,000 for graduate degree, \$10,000 for doctoral degree. Pillows, sheets, gift cards and cash donations among other items were graciously given in hopes that the home can be well supplied when it is complete.


