#### From the Treasurer.... Ways to send money to Pi Chapter....

- Using VENMO App to @Kathleen-Benedict-6

<u>Rationale</u>: It became obvious in our first days of Zooming Pi Chapter Meetings that we needed a method for submitting funds for donations, dues, Happy Jar, and other funds. Setting up a VENMO account was suggested as a quick way to transfer money. After talking to members and after research of the app, VENMO, I feel that I can offer two methods of submitting funds: by check via mail and by VENMO.

Currently, I am collecting donations for totes that were given to first year teachers at the Teacher Depot (This is a two year project. We have enough totes for two years.), any Happy Jar donations (however you wish to donate funds – each month, for all meetings at once, etc.), and donations to any scholarship funds.

By check... I am happy to receive and deposit any monies you want to send by this method. You can put all donations on one check and designate on the item line how the funds are to be distributed.

By VENMO...I have successfully loaded the app to my phone and received a donation towards the totes from Vikki Burns. I was able to link my VENMO account to our Pi Chapter bank account and the VENMO deposit went straight into our account. So, if you have an account or want to try this, I am ready. I have put instructions below for those who need them.

Directions for using VENMO:

1. Download the VENMO app from Google Play to your phone or computer. Set up your account

2. Link your VENMO account to your bank account or credit card – whichever you chose to be your funding source. In VENMO, you can pay people using any of the following: your VENMO balance (if you have access to your VENMO balance, a credit/debit card (imagine being able to pay a friend directly from your credit/debit card), and lastly, with a U. S. bank account.

3. Link your account to the account you wish to deposit money to, in this case, Pi Chapter, Kathleen Benedict. My User Name is: Kathleen-Benedict-6 (last 4 digits of her phone number 1646) Once you have sent me money, you won't need to put those 4 digits in again.


