SCHOOLS FOR AFRICA

Have you ever wondered about the green tub that's on the check in table at our chapter meetings? If you look closely you might recognize our own Vera Jo Henegar dressed as an African woman. She presented a program at our state convention telling members about a new project and the importance and need for help for African schools. Schools for Africa became DKG's first official international project in 2010. Paula Campbell presented a chapter program about the project dressed as an African woman too. Members were given small containers to put their change in to bring to the monthly meetings and so it unofficially became Schools for Africa: Change for Change. If we can donate the change in our billfolds at each meeting, it could make a huge difference. Since the inception of the partnership with UNICEF USA, members have donated \$445,134.90 to Schools for Africa. Currently the project works with 21 countries in sub-Saharan Africa. The SFA mission involves providing access to quality basic education for children, focusing on girls, orphans, and other vulnerable youngsters. UNICEF works through this project with governments, local authorities, communities and other partners. 
