<u>Ida Inez Gamble</u> - Ida was born in the Robertsville community in 1897 and died at her home in Clinton on May 5, 1993. She graduated from Clinton High School and the University of Tennessee Knoxville. She started teaching in 1918 as a fifth grade teacher at Robertsville. She taught Latin and English at Etowah, Decatur, Lake City and Powell and taught for 43 years. She served as chapter treasurer from 1958-1960. She was a longtime member of Memorial United Methodist Church, which gives a yearly scholarship in her name.

Dora Humphrey (June 26, 1905 – April 22, 1964) - We know from an article in the Clinton Courier that Dora was hired to teach at Melbourne Elementary in 1943.

Hello! My name is Krista Petrick. I teach 9-12 English in the Innovation Academy, and this is my sixth year working in the program. We are housed in the Business Building at the Anderson County Career and Technical Center. We use an online curriculum called Odysseyware, and the teacher can modify and create courses to meet each student's individual need. All of our students need to apply and interview for a spot in our program. The Innovation Academy has three distinct subprograms: Bridge Academy, Anderson County Online Learning Academy, and Opportunity Credits.

The Bridge Academy focuses on drop-out prevention. We accept Clinton High School and Anderson County High School students who are behind on credits and are at-risk of dropping out. The students are with us all day, every day for the entire school year (and sometimes for multiple years, if they entered the program early). We truly bond and grow to become a family. I love this part of my job!

The Anderson County Online Learning Academy focuses on bringing in former Anderson County homeschool students and other students who cannot attend regular education classes. These students are not at-risk for dropping out and are expected to graduate on time with their graduating class. However, there are many different reasons for why these students apply for a spot in this program.

The final aspect of the Innovation Academy is the Opportunity Credits. Any student who cannot take a class on campus for a particular reason (scheduling, jobs, etc.) can take a class with us and work at home to complete the credit. We also work with Middle College students and Work-based Learning students.

Due to the complexity and flexibility of our program, we offer after school tutoring hours on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4-6pm to allow our students to come into the classroom and work with us one-on-one. This is why I am not able to attend our chapter's DKG meetings, as they typically tend to fall on my tutoring days.

A Raffle of a "Home for the Holidays" basket (or two) will replace our Silent Auction as the major funding for our grants-in-aid. Think of merchants you might contact for a donation or items you can donate to the basket – such as: gift cards (restaurant, movies) UT items, candles, candy, wine, scarves, throw blankets, books, locally made items, etc. We need items you would enjoy using or that would make great Christmas gifts. Bring these items to the November meeting for our fund raising activity.

Key Pin of Xi State's First President Found!

While shopping on eBay, a Texas DKG member discovered for sale a DKG state president's keypin with S 35 36 on the back and purchased it. She searched historical records and concluded that only Tennessee and Colorado had state president's with last names beginning with S during the 35-36 Biennium. She contacted both states. Colorado responded it had the keypin of their president during that biennium. Xi State member Becky Sadowski, our International 1st Vice President, did the research and learned that Xi State did NOT have the keypin that had belonged to Tennessee's first DKG state president, Dr. Maycie K. Southall (1935-1936). Texas has offered to sale the pin to Tennessee and an Executive Board Ballot has been sent out. The hope is soon Xi State will have this keypin, in addition to Xi State's first initiate's keypin, for our Xi State President to wear during her biennium. How wonderful to have such a treasure returned to Xi State!
