

Dear Sisters,

We want to extend a heartfelt thanks to the committee chairs and our officers for a successful executive board meeting in July. We accomplished much and have a strategy for approaching our continued fellowship during the fall. Some of the many things we accomplished follow:

*We will be meeting through Zoom Meetings virtually until further notice for everyone's health. You do not have to have a Zoom account in order to join a Zoom meeting. All you have to do (the first time you join) is the follow the directions provided in the section of the newsletter labeled "Let's Zoom!". We believe this platform will serve Pi Chapter well. If you have questions regarding access, please reach out to either of us.

*You should have received a reminder card from the membership committee regarding scheduled DKG meeting dates and dues payment reminders for next year. Hopefully you can keep the card in a handy location. Of course, Pat will continue to send out newsletters, but we thought the card reminder was a great reminder option for you, our sisters.

*Pi Chapter funded the Anderson County and Clinton City Schools New Teacher Training Breakfast. At the Executive Committee meeting we also decided that in lieu of our previous program of having members bring in school supplies to distribute to new teachers in October, we would fund tote bags for the new teachers to utilize at the Teacher Depot sponsored through the Education Foundation for Anderson County and Clinton City Schools. We distributed fifty bags to new teachers, 45 in Anderson County and 5 in Clinton City Schools. Promotional material was placed in the bags regarding the activities and programs of Pi Chapter. We were able to purchase enough bags to continue this project for the next three years (based upon the average number of new teachers in both school districts). We will be asking that each current member contribute a small dollar amount this year for this project.

*Finally, we are looking into setting up a VENMO account for Pi Chapter to make it easier for you, our sisters to pay dues and make monetary donations to memorials and other projects throughout the year. We will fill you in on those details as they come about.

*Over the summer we have attended multiple zoom sessions from International and State along with the President to President monthly meetings to keep informed about happenings across our state and with the International organization. The week of July 07 – 10 were full of important topics to inspire and expand our knowledge. All sessions can be accessed through the DKG.org website. Join us for our first virtual Pi Chapter meeting on Tuesday, September 1, 2020, at 5:30 p.m. An email will be sent out on Sunday, August 30, with the link and will include the meeting ID and Passcode.

LET'S ZOOM!

- 1) Make sure you have a camera, speakers, and/or microphone on your device...a phone/tablet/computer works fine.
- 2) Open the link that will be sent to you inviting you to the meeting. The first time you join, the application will ask you to download/launch the zoom meeting app and will ask you to check your audio and video connections...if you don't have video, not a problem. If you have video you can always shut it down but remain in the meeting and listen. If you don't have audio/microphone, that could be a problem, you would be able to hear but not necessarily respond/participate during the meetings except through the "Chat" option. (I always use my earbuds with the built in microphone.)
- 3) Click on the three dots on your video screen that shows your name or symbol (device identity). You will see options to mute/unmute and stop/start video. Within that pane, at the top will be options for viewing other participants with arrows at the bottom of the pane for scrolling through participants.
- 4) The frame around the screen will drop in when you scroll over it to show chat options, raising a hand, and other options like adding a virtual background from your gallery.

Vera Jo Henegar DKG Grant

Pi Chapter and Xi State lost a Tennessee "Treasure" on January 22, 2019, when Vera Jo Henegar of Clinton, TN, a 47 year member of Pi Chapter, passed away. Vera served as a "Mother Hen" to many leaders in Xi State as well as nurturing members in her own Pi Chapter.

She loved DKG and indeed epitomized a "key woman educator". Vera taught school for 37 years from second grade to high school, teaching in Tennessee, Georgia, Indiana, and the Oslo American School in Oslo, Norway as she traveled with her husband in the Army.

Vera's leadership and encouragement to Pi Chapter and Xi State left not only an impressive legacy but a model for member involvement: 3 state offices including Xi State President (2001-2003), 4 chapter offices, 3 special award, 6 international committees, 18 Xi State committees, 22 Pi Chapter committees, 13 international conventions, 16 regional conventions, 39 TN Xi State conventions, 59 workshops and legislative seminars (often as guest speaker), and 18 times as guest speaker at Pi Chapter meetings. Her love of DKG Society, its mission and purposes as well as her DKG sisters clearly showed in her life of service. Pi Chapter sisters continue to honor Vera's life and legacy with this grant awarded annually to deserving women as they enter into the
