LET'S ZOOM!

- 1) Make sure you have a camera, speakers, and/or microphone on your device...a phone/tablet/computer works fine.
- 2) Open the link that will be sent to you inviting you to the meeting. The first time you join, the application will ask you to download/launch the zoom meeting app and will ask you to check your audio and video connections...if you don't have video, not a problem. If you have video you can always shut it down but remain in the meeting and listen. If you don't have audio/microphone, that could be a problem, you would be able to hear but not necessarily respond/participate during the meetings except through the "Chat" option. (I always use my earbuds with the built in microphone.)
- 3) Click on the three dots on your video screen that shows your name or symbol (device identity). You will see options to mute/unmute and stop/start video. Within that pane, at the top will be options for viewing other participants with arrows at the bottom of the pane for scrolling through participants.
- 4) The frame around the screen will drop in when you scroll over it to show chat options, raising a hand, and other options like adding a virtual background from your gallery.

<u>Rationale</u>: It became obvious in our first days of Zooming Pi Chapter Meetings that we needed a method for submitting funds for donations, dues, Happy Jar, and other funds. Setting up a VENMO account was suggested as a quick way to transfer money.

By check... I am happy to receive and deposit any monies you want to send by this method. You can put all donations on one check and designate on the item line how the funds are to be distributed.

By VENMO...I have successfully loaded the app to my phone and linked my VENMO account to our Pi Chapter bank account and the VENMO deposit went straight into our account. So, if you have an account or want to try this, I am ready. I have put instructions below for those who need them.

Directions for using VENMO:

- 1. Download the VENMO app from Google Play to your phone or computer. Set up your account
- 2. Link your VENMO account to your bank account or credit card whichever you chose to be your funding source. In VENMO, you can pay people using any of the following: your VENMO balance (if you have access to your VENMO balance, a credit/debit card (imagine being able to pay a friend directly from your credit/debit card), and lastly, with a U. S. bank account.
- 3. Link your account to the account you wish to deposit money to, in this case, Pi Chapter, Kathleen Benedict. My User Name is: Kathleen-Benedict-6 Password: 1646 You can go to www.venmo.com for more information.

Local Pi Chapter DKG Educators Honored

Congratulations to three Anderson County educators, both members of Pi Chapter, who were recently honored by the TN Organization of Delta Kappa Gamma Society, a society for key women educators. Diane Alsop, Oak Ridge City retired teacher/principal and Rhonda Phillips, current Clinton High School English teacher, were awarded the Order the Rose Award in Nashville at the State Convention, TN State Organization DKG. The Order of the Rose annually honors those members who have made outstanding contributions to chapter and community. Diane has chaired most of the committees of Pi Chapter and attends not only workshops but yearly conventions. Diane was recognized as an excellent educator in the Oak Ridge School System and the greater East TN area. She instituted many innovative summer, after school and in school programs such as Young Authors Camp, Career Camp, Black History Club and presented a series of workshops to parents entitled "Parents As Reading Teachers" - all in the interest of helping further the development of the young minds left to her care. She continues to this day educating the community as a docent at Coal Creek Miners Museum in Rocky Top, TN. Rhonda begins her 26th year of teaching English at Clinton High School this year. During this time, Rhonda has initiated curricular changes, taught at all levels, all grades, worked in cross-discipline courses as well as serving as an evaluator and District Team Member. She has guided the drama students, cheerleaders, dance team, sponsored the annual and creative publications, and acted as advisor of the National Honor Society. In Pi Chapter, Rhonda had served on various committees, served as President, attended workshops and state conventions. Pi Chapter member **Terri Gilbert**, retired English teacher, Clinton High School, submitted two acrylic paintings, "Alabama Falls" and "Mabry Mills" for judging in a nationally recognized contest for DKG. Ms. Gilbert's paintings were accepted for publication and display in the DKG Art Gallery in New York.

Spotlight on MembersLouise Childress

Pi Chapter's Louise Childress Still Making A Difference!

Pi Chapter member Louise Childress was recently featured in two articles by Ann Trail Campbell in the Courier News highlighting the "magic" she brought to Briceville Elementary School some 50 years ago. Mrs. Campbell recalls of Mrs. Childress, "It didn't take too long before I knew even at such a young age that I was amid greatness...She taught us so many techniques for creating art. She brought music to life. With every class she made me fall deeper and deeper in love with the arts. All the children loved her, and it wasn't only for her ability to draw, sing, and paint, but for her love and compassion."

At the end of each school year, many of the students would ask Mrs. Childress to "hang on to my artwork for me", Mrs. Campbell said. Louise Childress would and did. She stored them in her attic, for years and years. Recently, she began to clear out her attic gave all the saved artwork from her Briceville students to the Briceville Library to display and be claimed by their owners! Mrs. Campbell notes, "Lord knows how many pieces of art there actually are in the attic. Hundreds. Thousands." "Each work of art represents a sort of journey; a blossoming of a child's belief in themselves."

One former student, Katie (Leinart) Walker, who visited the Briceville Library to reclaim her art said, "I don't even remember second grade, but I remember Mrs. Childress. She was just a wonderful teacher." "Every single piece of art sitting in Briceville Library – every single piece of art Louise Childress promised to safeguard for her students – has a story behind it."

Mrs. Campbell ends her article with this sentiment, spoken, it seems, for all the many Briceville Elementary School students she taught through the years, "Thank you for shaping each of our lives in some way lovely lady. You will be forever pressed into the memories we hold so dear."

Pi Chapter sisters are so proud of our sister, Louise Childress, who epitomizes the best of our profession and the ideals of a Delta Kappa Gamma key woman educator!
