Dear Sisters,

During this spring and summer, many Pi Chapter members began preparing for the new biennium. A group attended the State Leadership Training that took place at Oak Ridge High School in April. Ann Gann and Kathleen were presenters. Then in June, Pat Aldridge, Kathleen Benedict, Vikki Burns, Ann Gann, Abbi Hill, and I attended the TNSO DKG Convention in Sewanee. Ann and Kathleen transported a display created by Amy Graham that received accolades from other attendees.

The Executive Board met in July to make plans for the first part of the year and beyond. The Committee to Digitize Historical Documents met twice, once to revisit the Google Drive where they have already housed many of the documents and once to clean out the DKG cabinet in the fellowship hall with the dual purposes of organizing materials and locating additional historical documents.

Amanda Powers, first vice president, arranged for some excellent programs to which the executive board also made contributions. Amanda researched whether we need to provide babysitting and found that at this time those services are not necessary. Pat Stonecipher and Chelsi Meredith met to plan for the services provided by the Communications/Publicity Committee, and Pat made submissions to the State History Committee's archives and Tennessee DKG News. Vikki Burns, second vice president, has been at work on the yearbook and membership directory. During her just completed tenure as second vice president, Linda McCune designed a yearbook template and shared it across the state making life easier for so many others this year. Chelsi Meredith has been working on giving anyone who would like a new DKG T-shirt a variety of options. Others in our chapter graciously accepted leadership positions on the executive board, as chairs of committees, as committee members, and unofficially as mentors to each other.

There were many highlights at Sewanee, but the most outstanding one for us was when Abbi was presented the Rosebud Award. The State Awards Committee, Vikki and Pat Aldridge included, kept the recipient's identity a secret which made the announcement even more exciting. There is only one Rosebud each year, so it is quite an honor.

Anderson County and Clinton City new teachers appreciated the Teacher Supply Depot tote bags. The ACS new teachers listened to information about DKG and some of opportunities available at the local, state, and international levels. It was nice that Rhonda was there as a facilitator and was able to add comments. Anderson County Schools needed 90 tote bags, and Clinton City Schools required 17. Only 14 bags remain.

Committee Reports





There are some other potential avenues for new teacher support and community needs: individual donation(s) of canned meats for the food pantry at Memorial United Methodist Church at the November meeting which is right before the holiday season, a donation or other help to an individual chapter in Kentucky for relief from recent flooding that severely damaged an elementary school or a donation given to Kentucky State DKG to be used for flood relief, and help for the Anderson County New Teacher Institute held in January or help with retention efforts made during the year. Other ideas?

The TNSO DKG Essay Contest has been broadened to include grades three through five. This expansion has added ten more schools. Marilyn Buckner and committee are going to meet this newest challenge while also serving the four middle schools included previously. Pi Chapter's 80th Birthday Celebration will be held on Founders' Day in May 2023. International President Becky Sadowski, who completed her two-year term on June 30, 2022, will be the guest speaker. As of July 1, she has transitioned from the presidency to being an International Board member. The 2022 TNSO Convention program book listed Pi Chapter and Omicron Chapter as hostesses for the Birthday Brunch on June 3, 2023. Whatever plans made for Pi's 80th birthday will be incorporated for use at the Birthday Brunch, so the timing is perfect.

Our next two chapter meetings will highlight DKG's seventh purpose which is to inform the members of current economic, social, political, and educational issues so that they may participate effectively in a world society. In September, Kevin Powers will speak about Hawk Time, a program at Clinton Middle School that provides enrichment and intervention for students that has resulted in a greater interest in attending high school. Since Covid, the dropout problem and mental health issues of some students has exacerbated; knowledge of a successful program that diminishes these issues should provide some applicable insight beyond the parameters of this one program. In October, Jim Dodson, a District 33 Tennessee State House of Representatives candidate and a middle school teacher in his 37th year, will speak about what his hopes are if elected. Jim's many honors and accomplishments are detailed online. John Ragan's history in the legislature is also available on the web. Both have an internet presence worthy of perusal.

During the past two days, two separate members on two different occasions have quoted the adage having to do with many hands making light work but in their own words. That seems fortuitous. Here's to a year of new beginnings and the continuation of past successes brought to fruition by many hands!
